

#### Day Skipper Theory course 2015/16 - Dates confirmed

Neill Chipping from Splash Adventure will be running the RYA Day Skipper course starting on 31<sup>st</sup> October and running until 12<sup>th</sup>December. The minimum needed to book the course have expressed an interest so the dates are now confirmed, there are still spaces, if you want to take part contact Mark Nichols.

- 31<sup>st</sup> October Day 1 (The rugby world cup starts at 16.00 so it may be necessary to finish early on this date)
- 7<sup>th</sup> November Day 2
- 14<sup>th</sup> November Day 3
- 21<sup>st</sup> November Day 4

There will then be a one week break for revision.

- 5<sup>th</sup> December Day 5
- 12<sup>th</sup> December Day 6
